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Subject: Y-12 National Security Complex – Unmanned Aerial System Overflight

Issue: On 4/02/2021, at 1747 hours, Y-12 National Security Complex Protective Force (PF) reported an Unmanned Aerial System (UAS) overflight

Context: On Friday Evening, 4/02/2021, at 1747 hours, Y-12 NSC PF reported a UAS over the south ridge of the Y-12 site. The PF observed the aircraft to be a black, 4-rotor or “Quad Blade” craft. The flight path was south to north. Altitude was only described as “at tree top level.” After about two minutes, the UAS left the area over the site’s north ridge.

Video surveillance, utilizing thermal imaging, was recorded and saved at the PF Central Alarm Station. The PF initiated appropriate response measures.

Significance: The Federal Aviation Administration and the Department of Energy in December 2017, directed that drone flights be restricted over all DOE facilities for the welfare of national security. These restrictions include nuclear assembly facilities, laboratories, and research centers.
